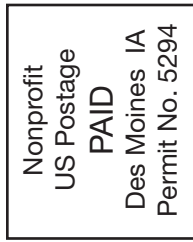

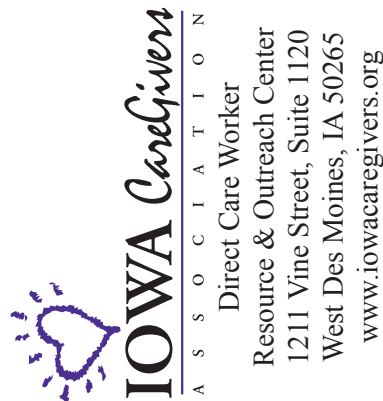

PURPOSE

Established in 2004, the Iowa CareGivers Association (ICA) Direct Care Worker Leadership Council provides valuable information to the ICA Board and staff that helps to ensure that ICA programs and services meet the needs of direct care workers.

The direct care workers who serve on the council are inspired to be leaders within the field of direct care. They share concerns, develop solutions, promote positive images of the direct care profession, and advocate for quality care for all Iowans.



WHO CAN APPLY

All direct care workers such as Certified Nursing Assistants (CNAs), Home Care Aides (HCAs), Rehabilitation Aides, Medication Aides, Hospice Aides, Patient Care Technicians, Direct Care Worker Mentors, Nutrition Aides, or Personal Support Staff are eligible to apply.

Must complete the ICA Leadership Program, "A Call to Leadership" before applying to serve on the Council.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTATIONS OF A COUNCIL MEMBER?

- Completion of the Iowa CareGivers Association (ICA) Leadership Program, "A Call to Leadership".
- An application must be completed by the direct care worker and approved by the ICA or the council.
- Attend at least 4 meetings a year.
- Abide by the ICA Code of Ethics.
- Share skills, knowledge, and experience.
- Show a commitment to the direct care profession and to council activities.
- Maintain confidentiality.
- Represent the ICA and direct care workers to the general public, policy makers, and other members of the community.
- Show a commitment to developing leadership skills and taking on new roles.
- Serve as an advisor to the ICA Board, Committees, and Staff.
